- New mission statement: The MHMR Foundation raises funds and fosters community support for the people and programs of MHMR.





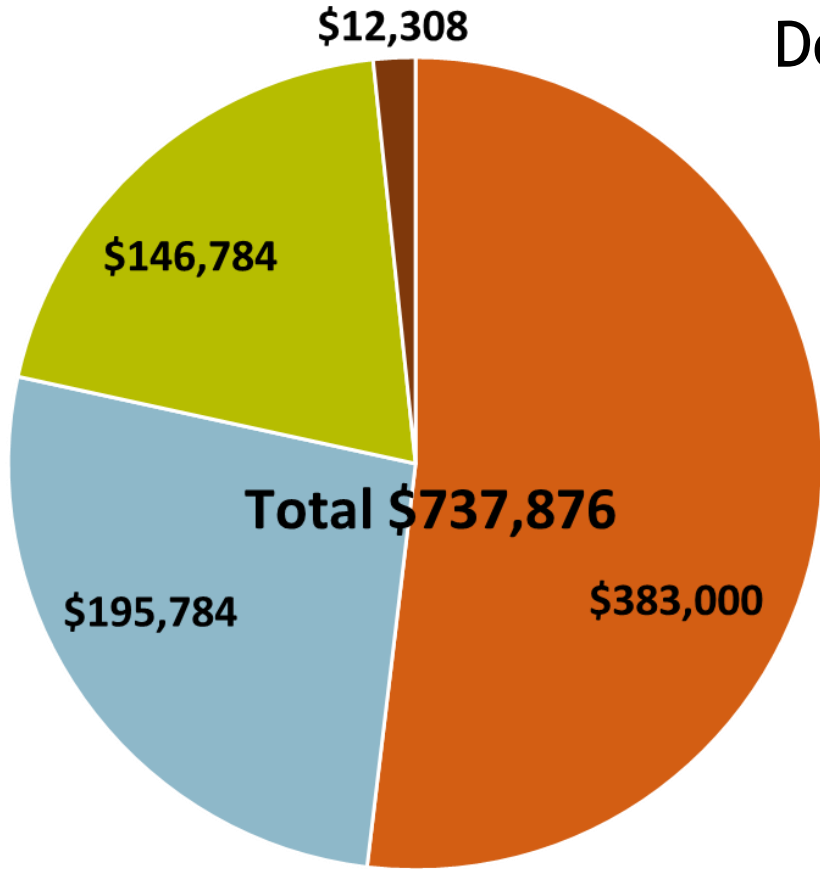

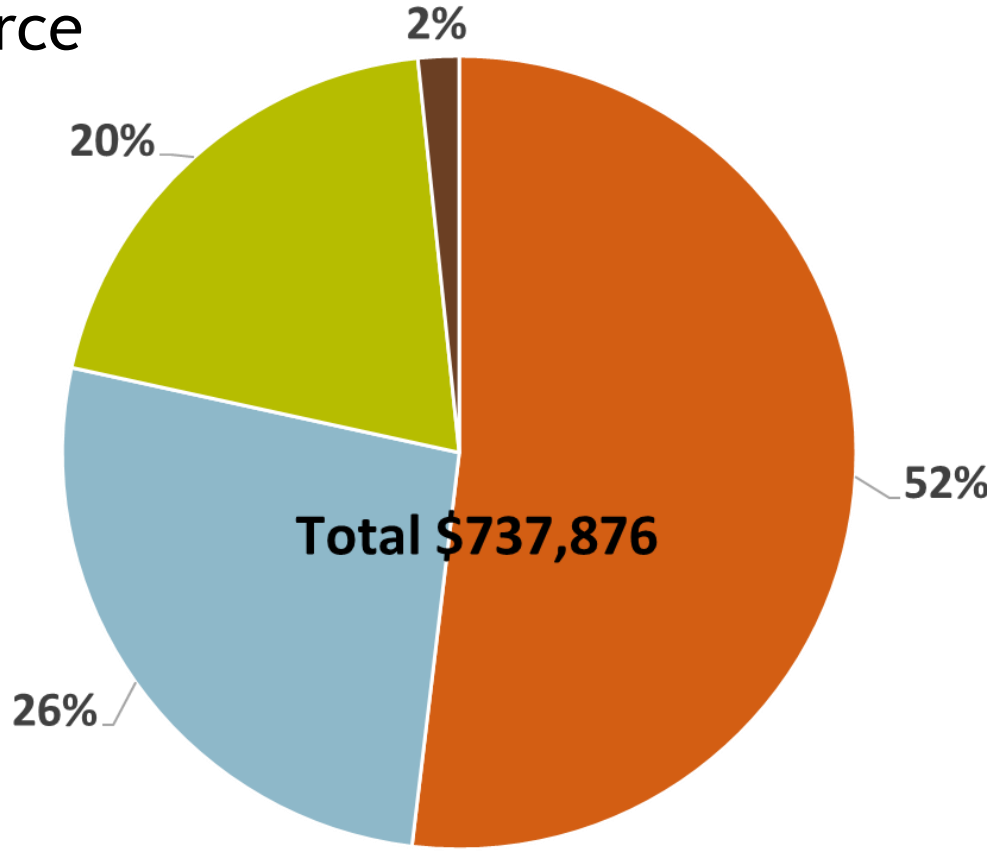

Donation Source

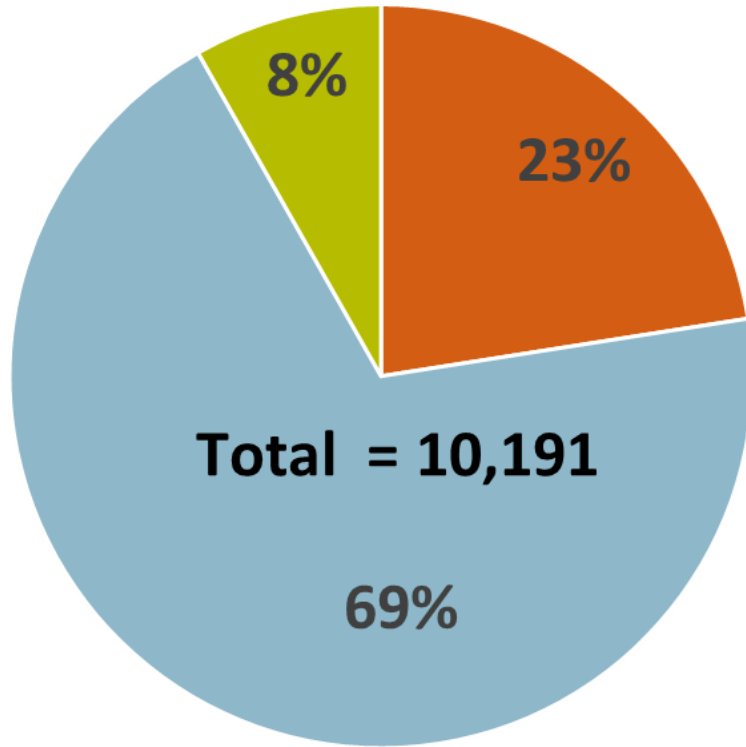

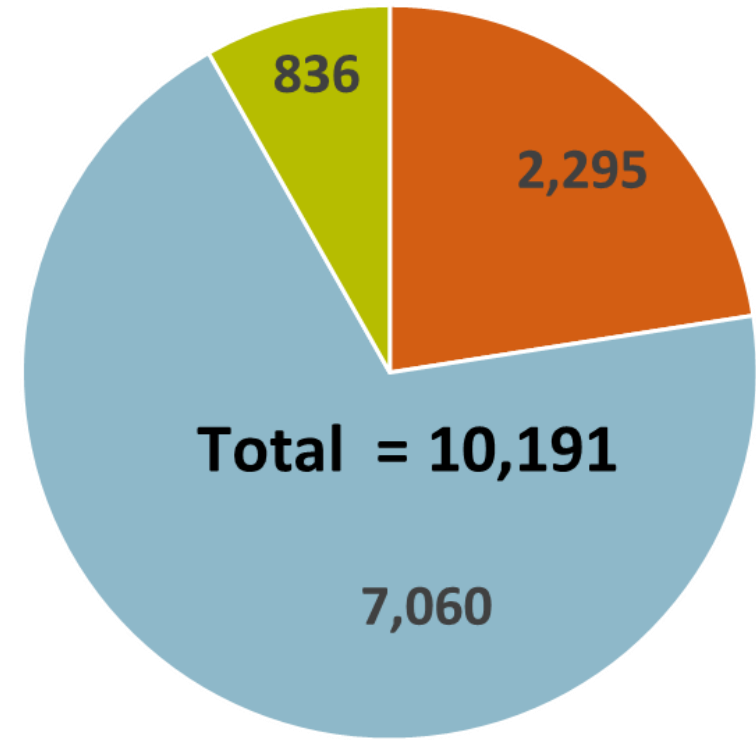

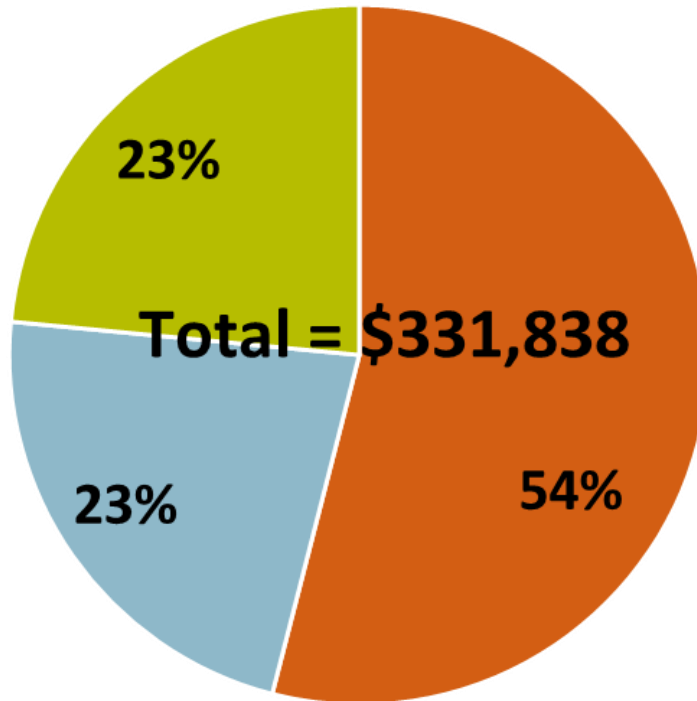

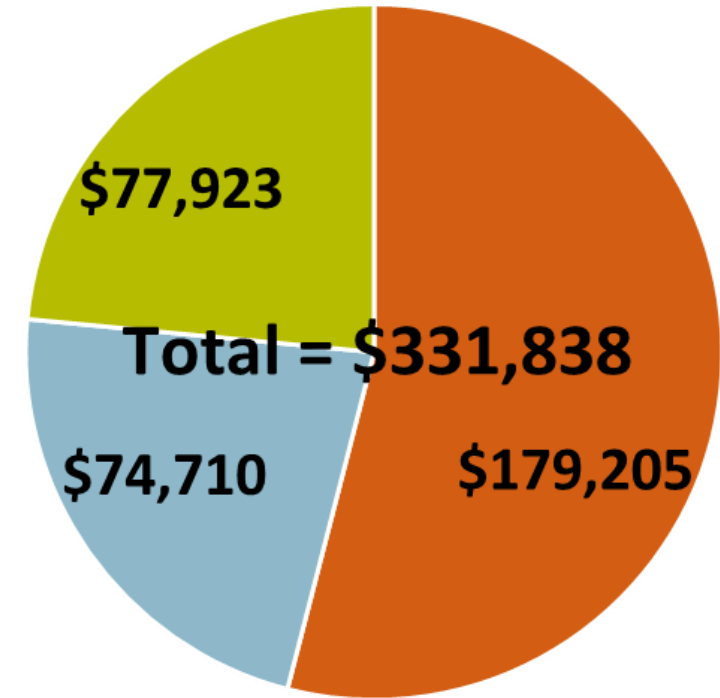

Behavioral Health

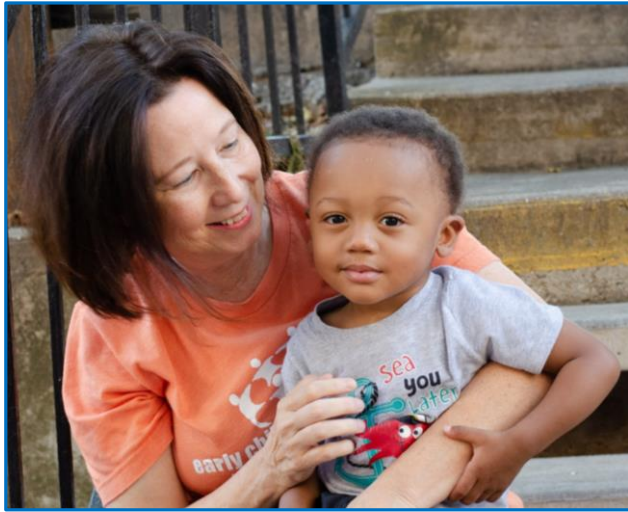
Mental Health | Substance Use Disorders | Crisis & Refugee Programs | Liberty House



- Refugee Services used funding from the Rainwater Charitable Foundation to support refugee families and children in the Fort Worth ISD
- The Community Center was able to host monthly parties, arts & crafts activities, and build a vegetable garden throughout the year.
- Liberty House veterans saw the positive benefits of donor support with community trips, gas cards and bus passes to go to work & attend school, and new house supplies including linens and furniture.
- The adolescent residents at the Youth Campus participated in outdoor adventure camps throughout the year.

- Day program participants enjoyed a full calendar of events and activities, including music therapy, outings throughout Fort Worth, a trip to the State Fair of Texas, and activities at the local YMCA.
- ABG vocational participants received a new commercial shredder to help increase productivity of shredding from across MHMR's programs and services. The day program participants received a number of new items to enhance their program including new outdoor furniture.
- Adults living in MHMR community residences (group homes) were able to celebrate monthly birthdays while community residents were able to have holiday gift cards for a Thanksgiving meal and a holiday gift.
